I declare that I hold a current buoyancy certificate (where applicable) and a valid certificate of insurance with minimum 3rd party cover of £3 million which will cover me whilst racing in the Salcombe Town Regatta. I understand that the Salcombe Town Regatta Committee accepts no responsibility for any loss or damage, injury, or inconvenience to persons or yachts, however arising, directly or indirectly from their rules, policy or rulings during the races or related activities.

I accept full responsibility for the seaworthiness and safe navigation of the above yacht and its crew shall use their own judgement whether to start, continue or retire from a race in the existing and forecast conditions. Nothing done by the organisers can reduce the responsibility of the yacht nor will it make the organisers responsible for loss, damage, death or personal injury, however it may have occurred, as a result of the yacht taking part in racing. The organisers encompass everyone helping to run the race and the event and include the organising authority, the Race Committee, the race officer, patrol boats and beachmasters. The provision of patrol boats does not relieve the yacht of its responsibilities.

The sailing instructions for this event will be the Salcombe Yacht Club Sailing Instructions 2019 as amended or supplemented by this Notice. In the event of a conflict between the Salcombe Yacht Club Sailing Instructions and this Notice, this Notice shall prevail. Amendments to this Notice and/or to the Sailing Instructions will be posted on the Town Regatta Notice Board in the Salcombe Yacht Club.

4 races are scheduled for each Class (one per day).

A Series for a Class shall be constituted by the completion of any one of that Class's races.

If 4 races are sailed, there will be 1 discard. If 3 or fewer races are sailed, there will be no discard.

For the Handicap and Junior All Comers Cup Classes, the RYA's published Portsmouth Numbers will be used as the handicapping system.

The Slow and Fast Handicap Classes will be split on receipt of entries and displayed on the noticeboard at the Salcombe Yacht Club on Sunday 12th August.

The Handicap Classes are limited to boats with a maximum RYA Portsmouth Number of 1220.

The Race Committee will comprise: Ian Stewart, Wendy Stewart and such other persons as they may appoint.

BOAT PARKING ON MILL BAY

Millbay is privately owned and use of the beach is at the discretion of the owners.

- 1. Sailing dinghies may be parked on the beach only with permission.
- 2. Permits are issued on a weekly basis (with a maximum of 4 weeks) and must be displayed on the boat at all times. There is a donation of £10.00 per week per boat, the surplus of which will go to local charities.
- 3. Permits can be purchased at the Welcome Reception.
- 4. Boats left on the beach beyond their permit will be removed at the boat owner's expense.
- 5. All boats and accessories are left entirely at the boat owner's risk.

Please note that there is a section of the beach in front of the houses where boat parking is not permitted. Please leave access to the estuary free for the residents and refer to the Notices on the beach.

The National Trust owns Mill Bay Car Park and the approach to the beach. Time will be allowed to unload boats but cars and road trailers must be removed from the road immediately.

For the benefit of all, the beach owners request:

- 1. No barbecues, fires or beach parties.
- 2. No undue noise or loud music.
- 3. Dogs should be kept on leads between 10.00 a.m. and 5 p.m.
- 4. All rubbish should be taken away.
- 5. No outboards or road trailers to be left on the beach at any time.
- 6. Night fishing only and seaward of Mill Bay.
- 7. No mooring of any boats on the foreshore.
- 8. No camping.
- 9. No driving or parking of any motor vehicles.

Boat Trailers may be left at Salcombe Primary School, Onslow Road, TQ8 8AG from 12pm on Friday 2th Aug.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

All races will be governed by the current World Sailing Racing Rules of Sailing, the prescriptions of the Royal Yachting Association, the rules of each Class concerned and the Sailing Instructions that shall be used to cover the Regatta and this Notice. All dinghies must have a valid Measurement Certificate with current buoyancy endorsement and 3rd party insurance with minimum cover of £3million, proof of which may be called for by the Race Committee. The Race Committee reserves the right to make any alterations it may deem necessary.

The Race Committee may at its discretion take out any class entered in the Handicap Class to provide them with class racing, similarly any class may be combined with the Handicap Class. Sailing Instructions may be collected from the Yacht Club. The Time Limit will be 3 hours and any boat which fails to finish within this time shall be deemed to have retired. When no more boats will be credited with finishing, two sound signals will be sounded and all signals, except those indicating protests, lowered. SAIL NUMBERS MUST BE COMPLETE AND CORRECT. Any boat sailing with a sail number other than as entered may be deemed not to have entered.

The Salcombe Estuary is very popular with pleasure and commercial craft. Please show consideration for other users and sail safely at all times. If you are in collision with a non-competing boat, whether it be under way or moored, you must report the incident to the Harbour Office and fill in the appropriate form. You must also complete a 360 degree penalty turn.
